We are excited to announce that, in August 2020, we achieved our goal of building 10 homes and serving 100 children. The question then became, "What's next?" In Psalms 37:4, it says: *"Take delight in the Lord and He will give you the desires of your heart."* So be it, we prayed: "Father God, if the work of King's Kids Africa is pleasing to you, then ask us to do even more." Well, God answered our prayers and He called us to add 2 more children to each of our homes and to build 1 more home - our 11th. God willing, this will bring our total to 132 children by the end of 2021



### Bring Kingdom Infrastructure to Rural Uganda

Build an orphan home to support 12 children and 2 house mommas:  
**\$35,000**

Support 12 children with living expenses and education for one year:  
**\$7,800 (or \$650 per child per year)**

Support women's sewing ministry for long-term sustainability:  
**\$250 buys a sewing machine, fabrics or notions**

Build a church and impact a community with the Kingdom of God:  
**\$80,000**

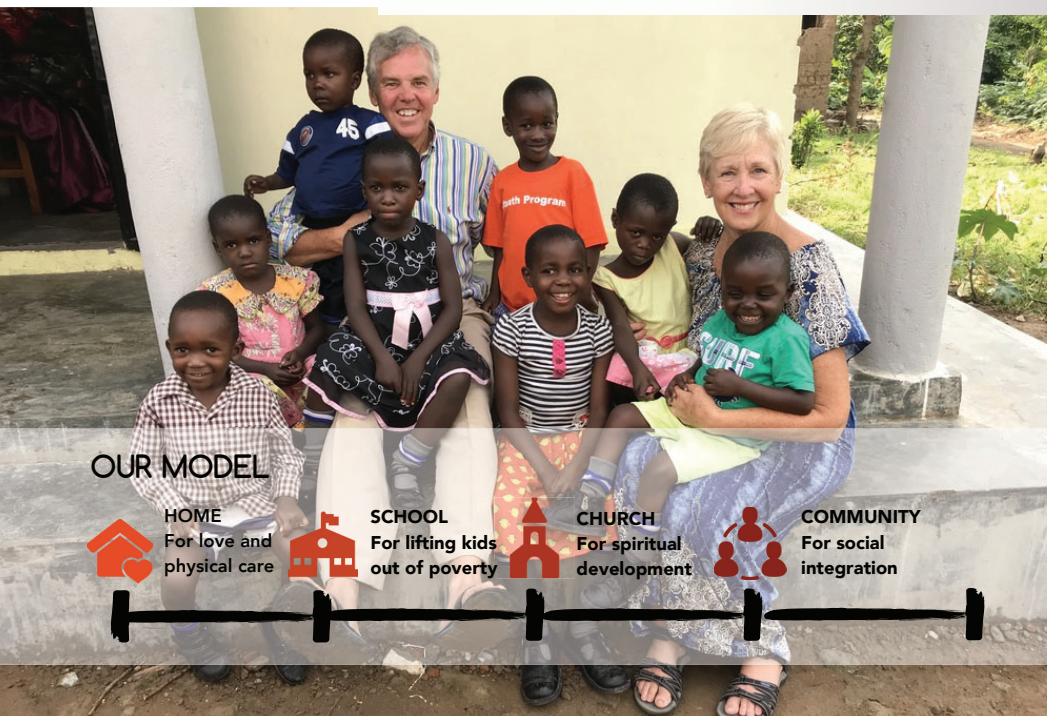
## OUR MISSION

Our mission is to glorify and honor God by caring for orphans and the neediest of His children in Africa (with a focus on rural Uganda) by providing family-based care, education and a local church family.

### Locked in Hopelessness

The cycle of poverty is an all too common reality for the orphans of Africa. Finding the key to executing quality orphan care that changes the trajectory of a child's life is vital.

- An estimated 2.5 million orphans are currently living in Uganda.
- Orphanages are often unable to equip children for life on their own after "aging out" (normally at the age of 18)
- Children's villages are often institutionalized and isolated from the broader community.
- Without a church family and the security of a loving home, children suffer mentally, emotionally, and spiritually.

## OUR SUSTAINABLE APPROACH

### Collaborative Church Partners

- Identify local churches in Uganda who have demonstrated a love for children and are doing all they can to care for orphans, but they need a helping hand.
- Provide the start-up resources and life care support for the orphan homes, while the local church retains full ownership and is responsible to achieve long-term sustainability.
- Position the local church to be viewed by the community as the care provider.

### Invaluable Partners

Our two partners have been carefully chosen for their long-term records of cooperation and impact:

- **The Global Orphan Project** serves more than 12,000 children internationally and 30,000 domestically.
- **The Presbytery of East Africa** has planted more than 130 churches in Uganda and Kenya.

### Leverage Funds and Partnerships to Build Kingdom Infrastructure:

- **Homes** that will house orphans and the house moms (mostly widows) who will provide family-based care for the children, creating a new loving family.
- **Churches** that will spiritually and emotionally support the orphans and widows of the homes and transform the community for the kingdom of God.
